



L.E.A.D. DIY

L.E.A.D. DIY stands for Lighting & Epilepsy Awareness Development! L.E.A.D DIY aims to promote safety at shows for people who are sensitive to light.

GREEN
Low risk signs mean the lighting used is unlikely to severely effect anyone with light sensitivity. The signs can be hung even when the show has no lighting!

Should I put a wallet in someone's mouth while they have a seizure? NO! Remember to keep a person's airway clear- a wallet would obstruct breathing! No need to panic!

FAQ #1

If a person is having a seizure, lay them on their side and have something soft and flat under their head! light sensitive- think strobes may be intense for people who are used at the show

First Aid

RED warning signs mean the lighting used at the show may be intense for people who are light sensitive- think strobes

First Aid

Try to be reassuring and calm with a person after a seizure. Do not offer them food or water, and stay with them until they're safe!

Caution

YELLOW caution signs mean that the lighting may affect some people, but doesnt include frequent flashing or fast paced lights!



FAQ #2

Does weed help people with epilepsy? Yes-for some! Different treatments help different people manage their seizures. CBD works!
